Select Health of South Carolina reimbursement policies and their resulting edits are based on guidelines from established industry sources, such as the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the American Medical Association (AMA), state and federal regulatory agencies, and medical specialty professional societies. Select Health of South Carolina may use reasonable discretion in interpreting and applying its policies to services provided in a particular case and may modify its policies at any time.

In making claim payment determinations, the health plan also uses coding terminology and methodologies based on accepted industry standards, including Current Procedural Terminology (CPT); the Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS); and the International Classification of Diseases, 10th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-10-CM), and other relevant sources. Other factors that may affect payment include medical record documentation, legislative or regulatory mandates, a provider's contract, a member's eligibility in receiving covered services, submission of clean claims, and other health plan policies, and other relevant factors. These factors may supplement, modify, or in some cases supersede reimbursement policies.

This reimbursement policy applies to all health care services billed on a CMS-1500 form or its electronic equivalent, or when billed on a UB-04 form or its electronic equivalent.

Policy Overview

This policy provides an overview of reimbursement limitations for chiropractic services based on plan coverage. Chiropractic care provides members with services for manual manipulation of the spine to correct a dislocation that has resulted in a neuromusculoskeletal condition.

Reimbursement Guidelines

Chiropractic manipulation (CPT codes, 98940-98942) must be billed with a primary diagnosis of subluxation and a secondary diagnosis for the symptoms associated with the diagnosis of subluxation for reimbursement. The plan allows 6 visits per year for members. Prior authorization for patients under the age of 18 is required before any treatment is provided. Diagnostic x-rays to determine the existence of a vertebral subluxation are eligible for reimbursement.

CPT Code	Code Description
98940	Chiropractic manipulative treatment (CMT); spinal, 1— 2 regions
98941	Chiropractic manipulative treatment (CMT); spinal, 3— 4 regions
98942	Chiropractic manipulative treatment (CMT); spinal, 5 regions

Chiropractic manipulative treatment codes (98940-98942) will be denied if billed more than one time per service date.

X-rays are limited to 2 per State Fiscal Year and limited to the following:

- Radiologic Examination; Spine, Entire, Survey Study; Anteroposterior and Lateral
- Radiologic Examination; Spine, Cervical; Anteroposterior and Lateral
- Radiologic Examination; Spine, Thoracic; Anteroposterior and Lateral
- Radiologic Examination; Spine, Thoracolumbar; Anteroposterior and Lateral
- Radiologic Examination; Spine, Lumbosacral; Anteroposterior and Lateral

Definitions

Vertebral subluxation

One or more vertebrae in the spine become misaligned, compressing spinal nerves and disturbing optimal nerve function.
